This IL-10 is painted according to NKAP's Directive of July 3, 1943: upper and side surfaces were camouflaged in AMT-1 light brown, AMT-4 dark green and AMT-12 dark grey with under surfaces AMT-7 light blue

IL-10 'white 5' of Major Aleksenko V.A., twice Hero of the Soviet Union, 15 Guards ShAP, July of 1945.

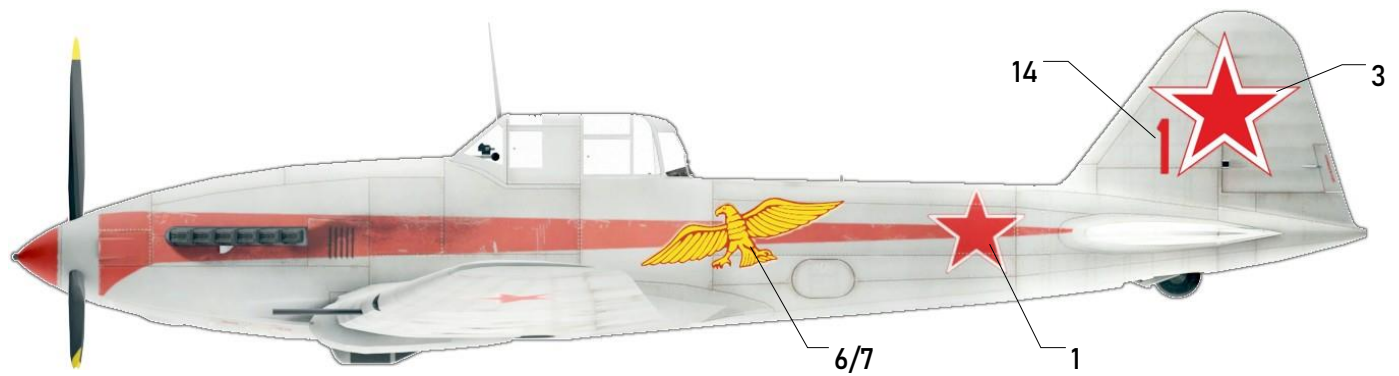
Painting is standard for the postwar IL-10: top - dark green AMT-4 overall, bottom - light blue AMT-7.

IL-10 'red 1' of Major General Shundrikov V.P., commander of the 2nd Guards SHAD, Group of Soviet Forces in Germany, 1952 r.

The aircraft is entirely painted with aluminum lacquer. The rear gunner's cannon is unmounted.

IL-10 of 175 ShAP, Latvia, summer of 1945.

The inscription "Bought with crew's personal savings" (left side only) was first applied to this crew's IL-2 in 1944 and was later transferred to the new postwar IL-10.

Painting: top - dark green AMT-4 overall, bottom - light blue AMT-7.

Painting: top - dark green AMT-4 overall, bottom - light blue AMT-7.

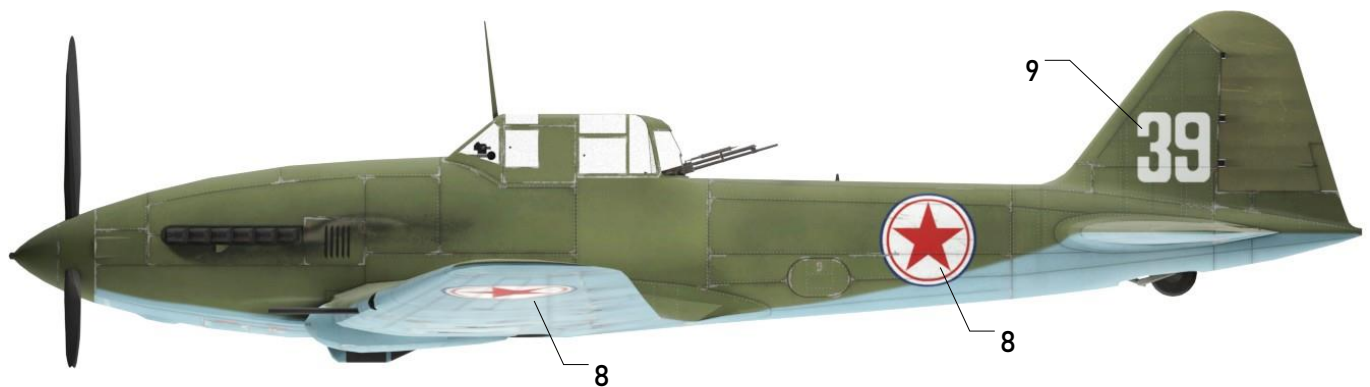

IL-10 of North Korean Air Force, Kimpo Air Base, summer of 1950.

Painting is similar to Soviet IL-10s: top - dark green AMT-4 overall, bottom - light blue AMT-7

Roundels are in 4 positions - wings bottom and fuselage sides.

The red stars with a thick white and thin red outline were in six positions: tail, fuselage sides and wings bottom.

Internal surfaces (cockpit, landing gear niches) – A-14 steel grey.

Prop blades – black from both sides.
