The photos were shot on February 22, 1942, in the Factory №1, when they were delivered to 172 IAP
Note:

- Freshly painted white upper surfaces with light blue under surfaces
- White propeller blades
- Red spinner tip and arrows are darker than stars
- Stars on the fuselage sides are slightly rotated

MiG-3 'Red 02', 120 IAP/12 GvIAP, Vnukovo AF (Moscow) March 7, 1942

The line-up of MiG-3s was photographed at Vnukovo Airfield on 7 March 1942 during the ceremony to rename the 120th IAP as the 12th GvIAP. For many years, it was believed that the wing consoles of the 'Red 02' were red, but most likely it was green and only the right console without a slat, being replaced during the repair.

MiG-3 'Black 112', 120 IAP, Kalinin Front, winter 1941-42

Note:

- Gloss white upper surfaces and light blue undersurfaces
- Black propeller blades
- Stars on the fuselage sides are slightly rotated

MiG-3 'For the Motherland', 42 IAP, Lt. German G.I., Bryansk Front, August 1941

The photos were shot by German photographers and show the plane abandoned on a captured airfield on late summer or fall 1941.

Note:

- Glossy finish
- Black propeller blades
- The tail star is smaller and shifted
- No photo evidence of the slogan on the right side



Size is equal to model size, can be used for cutting masks

Note:

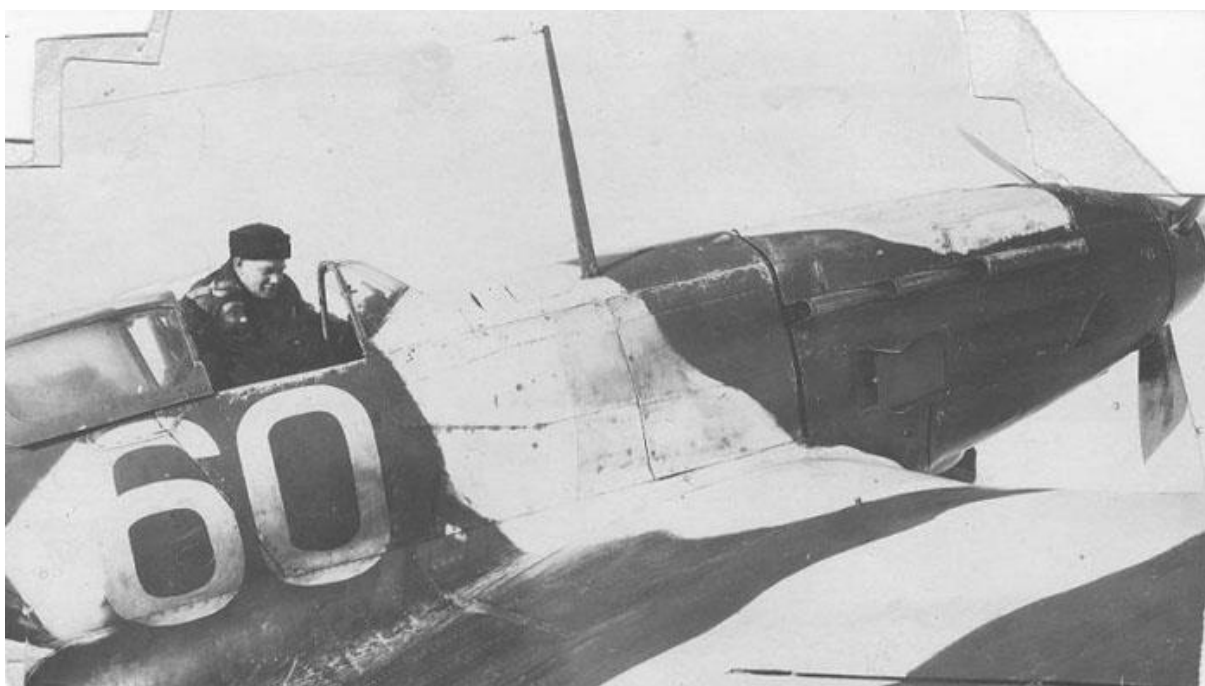
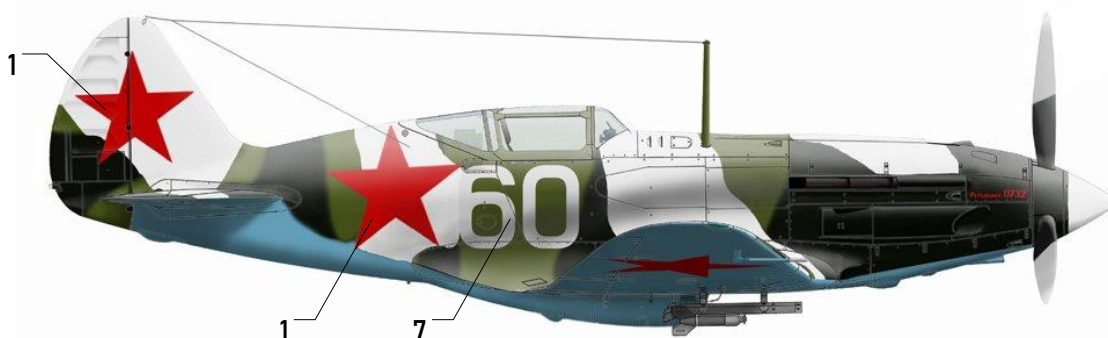
- Black engine cowlings and propeller blades
- White spinner
- Stars on the fuselage sides are rotated



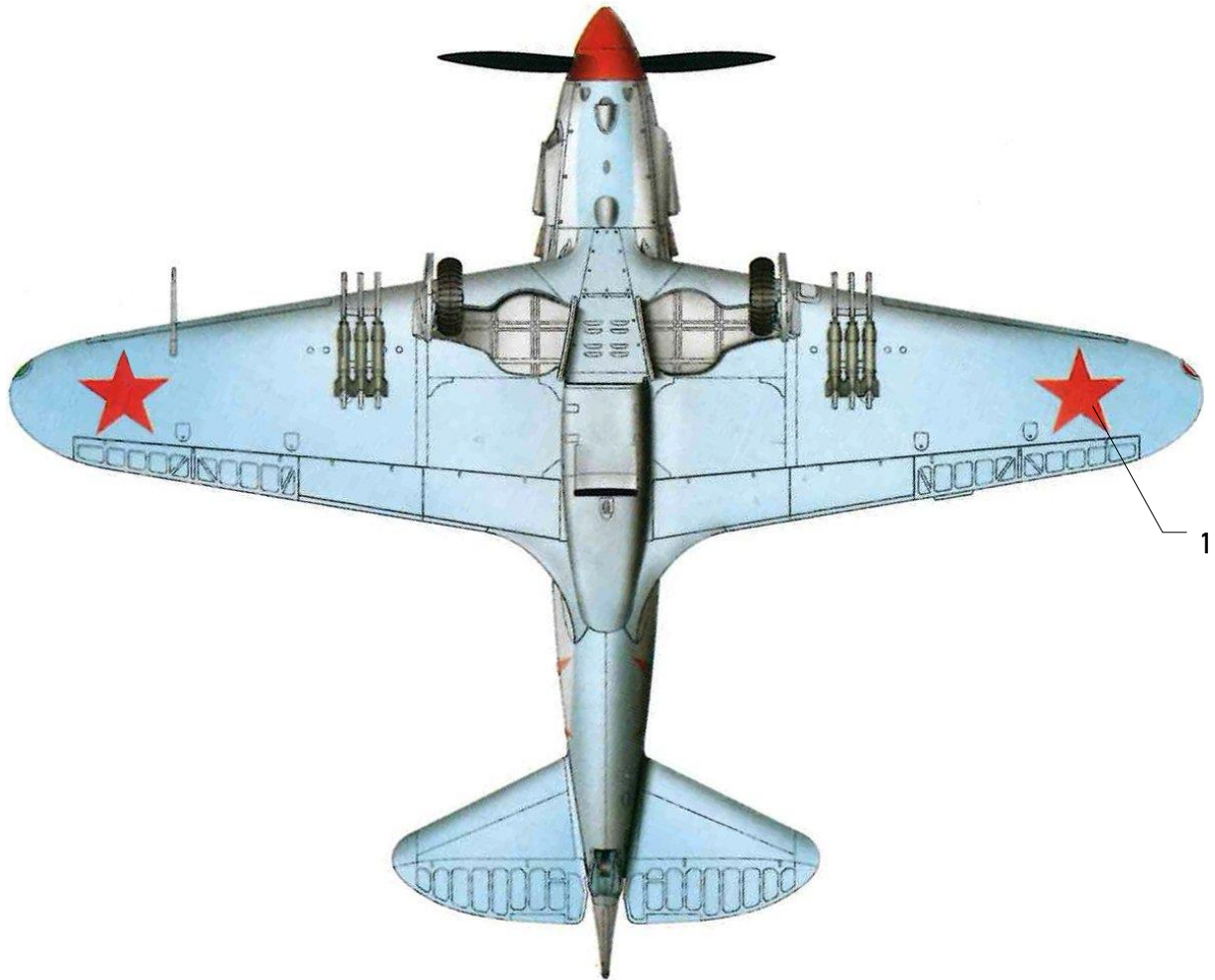

MiG-3 'White 60', 154 I AP, Leningrad Front, winter 1941-42

The white 60 seems to be camouflaged with white disruptive bands, which were accurately executed using a spray brush and masks. The bands leave the green and black bands of the temporary camouflage visible, but it seems that they predominantly cover black areas.

General painting guide

The red stars without outline were in six positions: tail, fuselage sides and wings bottom.

Internal surfaces (cockpit, landing gear niches) – A-14 steel grey.
